

Today CEA and CUSD negotiation teams met.

CUSD was given a list of questions more than seven days ago. Today we received several responses.

Although CEA did not receive answers to all questions, the team moved forward with a counter proposal in hopes of an MOU before the district imposes the October 5<sup>th</sup> return date for SPED, Preschool and EL students.

- CUSD refused to provide data on the number of CUSD employees tested positive and/ or died from Covid-19 when asked. Despite Compton having amongst the highest rate in the county, CUSD has stated that they did not see the relevance of this data and have refused to provide it.
- CUSD's plan for **October 5th** is distinct from a full reopening or moving to a full hybrid instruction model for all students.
- When asked who is responsible for monitoring sanitizing, CUSD had a vague understanding of the term "sanitizing." CEA played superintendent Brawley's video. He clearly stated CUSD's plan for sanitizing. It is obvious that CUSD is not following their own protocols. <https://youtu.be/7EnCeixm3qE> (go to 1:46 seconds of video.)
- CUSD claimed the term "newcomers" was vague when asked how many EL and newcomer students are enrolled in the district. Yet, one of the district's team members defined the term.
- CUSD has allocated each school 10% of the student population, including SPED and EL Learners. **10% of the total population (including**

**employees) is the maximum per site allowable by law.**

- CUSD is focused on bringing back SPED MM/MS and EL students on October 5<sup>th</sup>. CUSD claims that substitutes have been trained to provide support to EL students at the secondary level.
- CEA adamantly rejected this return date. Instead, the team proposed January 11<sup>th</sup> as the return date.

CEA – proposed a change to add more time for professional development, office hours, no home visits, evaluations for probationary teachers and those who are in cycle that wish to continue to be evaluated this year, training, ppe, plexiglass for desks, gowns, gloves, face shields, teachers and students will only be required to clean their own work space, district information about classrooms being measured to safely for 6ft spacing.
